LAW CHANGES

The laws are published by the World Bridge Federation and were last revised in 2017. From 1 January 2024 there have been a couple of law changes to both covering aspects of a player's actions at the table. Below is the one that is most significant:

Law 73 - Communication, Behaviour, Tempo and Deception

This states that calls or play are to be made without emphasis, mannerisms or inflection, and intentional haste or hesitation. If, however, there is an action of any of the above, partner **must** avoid using that information. In summary, the wording changes remove ambiguity of potential actions. For example, if your partner hesitates in bidding (with the contract possibly being bid to game) then passes, your bid to game is at risk of the Director being called with a potential penalty resulting. Variation in tempo in bidding or play is unfortunately quite common.
