### NZ Bridge

- National Bridge Congress - We had to defer Congress from September this year but we have new dates for the same 2021 National Congress. The exact dates will be Thursday February 10th until Thursday February 17th. We have updated the Congress website to reflect this including new dates for each event. All events will be rescheduled. The most significant change will be that the Congress will start with New Zealand Open and Restricted Open Teams and finish with New Zealand Open and Restricted Open Pairs. We will still have a National Congress, Covid permitting. We are confident that as long as Tauranga remains orange or green that the Congress will take place, live. You will need to be double vaccinated to attend.

## Building Update

This last month we have made substantial progress towards the building becoming a reality.

- The Napier City Council has officially approved us leasing reserve land on which to build, subject to there being no objections during the 30 day public notification period which expires on 24 December. We have been advised that there have been no objections so far.
- We have secured a corporate sponsor who will make a substantial contribution to our building fund.
- Our application to the Lottery Grants Board was successful and we will receive \$74 000.
- Yesterday we received a draft copy of the NCC lease. The lease would begin on 24 December 2021 provided no objections to the public notification is received. The initial annual will be \$1500+GST. The draft document will be perused. The NCC officer indicated there was very little opportunity to make any changes as it is a standard council lease for clubs leasing reserve land.
- We have received the quote for the shell from Coresteel, and as you are aware the costs of building materials and the freight has increased hugely. The price is a lot higher than the original estimate. We arranged a meeting with Coresteel this Tuesday. The outcome is we will need to continue to fund raise to ensure we start our occupancy debt free.

## Fundraising

YTD, including November, (from 1 October 2020) we have raised \$8436 from the additional \$1 table money and raffles etc.

The latest cost estimates however have risen substantially and there is a shortfall of tens of thousands of dollars.

**We would very much welcome any donations from members (don't forget we are a registered charity so you can claim a third of the donation) .**
