Building Update - The Building Committee has chosen Coresteel to build our new clubrooms. We have signed a contract for \$21,600 (deposit of \$10 800 paid) for the Architectural and Structural design, Fire report and design. Coresteel met with the architectural draughtsman, the plumber and NCC rep at the site to discuss where the building will go. They are organising a surveyor to prepare the site plan.

Ash and Jo met with Derek and Lyn Evans from Napier City Country Music Club to update them on progress to date.

Our application to ECCT Grassroots Fund was a success and we have received \$5000 towards our operating expenses. This will allow us to put more money into our reserves for building. No word from Lotteries or COGs yet.
